

- 6. With a view to meeting the expenses likely to be incurred every affiliate shall contribute.
- 7.Our AIBPARC, Jharkhand Region Triennial Conference is falling due during the month of December 2025. It is decided to hold the same on 14/12/2025.
- 8.A constitution Committee was constituted comprising of following members: 1.Com. L Giri, Joint Convener, 2. Com.S.K.Mazumder, Joint Convener, 3.Com N.K.Sahi, Member, 4. Com G.K.Sinha, Member, 5. Com S.K.Sinha, Member, 6. Com Ram Bali Ram, Member, 7. Com S.K.Pathak, Member & 8. Com P.K.Deogharia, Member.

Term of Reference: 1. Structure of the committee, 2. Annual membership fees

Report should be submitted latest by 31/10/2025. Statement of Accounts were presented and was unanimously approved and adopted.

During the meeting, CBROA, Jharkand gave a cheque for Rs.2,010/- as AIBPARC membership fee for 2025-26. Also, contributed Rs.2,000/- towards expenses to be incurred during proposed Hunger strike here. Vote of thanks was proposed by Com. P.K.Deogharia.

As per call of CBPRO, Hunger Strike was conducted on 18/7/2025, at Ranchi by all affiliates of AIBPARC, Jharkhand. As many as 50 members participated in the Hunger Strike. CBROA members also made due representation. Members from CBROA who were on Hunger Strike included: Sri B P Agrawal, Sri Rajesh Kumar, Sri D P Shah, Sri R P Chaudhary & Sri G K Sinha. Participation by CBROA members was well appreciated. AIBPARC, Jharkhand State

Secretary Sri Debashish Sengupta elaborated on our demands and reasons which compelled the senior citizens to go Hunger Strike. Leaders from other affiliates also spoke and expressed concern over indifferent approach of IBA & DFS towards the retirees.

Addressing the participants, Sri G K Sinha spoke and explained in details our demands and compulsion to sit for Hunger Strike, without taking even water. Though Seniors, age didn't deter their spirits. And, all of them behaved as if they are like "young" boys. Growing old is mandatory, but living young is our choice. The Hunger Strike concluded at 5.30 pm. It was was a grand success and a great show of strength and solidarity.

To commemorate the Bank Nationalization Day, AIBPARC (All India Bank Pensioners' and Retirees' Confederation), Jharkhand conducted Tree plantation program, on July 19, 2025 at Baram panchayat, nearly 10 km from Ranchi. Trees (03 nos each) were distributed to more than 50 villagers, in presence of the Mukhiya and a large number of villagers. Sweet packets were also distributed to participants.

All affiliates including CBROA (Canara Bank Retired Officers' Association) actively participated in the program.

KERALA

JOINT FORUM OF BANK RETIREES KASARAGOD/AIBPARC/CBROA, REPORT ON THE HUNGER STRIKE HELD AT KASARAGOD ON 19^{TH} JULY.

Under the banner of the Joint Forum of Bank Retirees and Pensioners, a much-discussed Hunger Strike was held on 19th July 2025 at Kasaragod, in commemoration of Bank

Nationalisation Day. The event witnessed a remarkable and inspiring participation of nearly 250comrades from various important centers across KANNUR and KASARAGOD Districts, namely Tellicherry, Kannur, Taliparamba, Payyanur, Cheruvathur, Nileshwar, Kanhangad, and Kasaragod.65soldiers of the joint forum observed hunger strike as against 50 expected. Sri V Manoj welcomed the guests of honours and participants and explained the circumstances under which the Bank Retirees are to go for this HUNGER STRIKE

The hunger strike commenced at 10:00 AM and was inaugurated by Sri N A Nellikunnu, Hon. MLA of Kasaragod. In his passionate and supportive address, the MLA:

Appealed to the Central Government and authorities concerned to immediately resolve the long-pending and just demands of the bank retirees. Expressed deep anguish that even after 25 years, Pension Updation, a rightful entitlement of the retirees, remains unimplemented. Stated that retirees played a crucial role in building the strength and reputation of Public Sector Banks in India and now deserve dignity and justice. Strongly criticized the government for forcing senior citizens, many of whom are in their 70s and 80s, to undertake a Hunger Strike on a day that marks the very ethos of nationalisation and public welfare. Demanded that the government must implement Pension Updation in line with the Reserve Bank of India pattern, provide uniform DA for all retirees, Health insurance premium should be borne by respective Banks.

His inspiring words infused renewed energy among the participants and reinforced the legitimacy of their struggle.

Dr Ashokan, Syndicate Member of Kannur University, Director of KILA, and Professor of Economics, delivered the keynote address, highlighting the economic rationale and moral imperative for implementing pension justice. He emphasized how pension updation is not a burden but a rightful continuity of service recognition.

PPJ Nair, Joint Convenor of the Joint Forum of Bank Retirees, presided over the event. In his presidential speech, he underlined the resilience and unity of bank retirees, reaffirmed commitment to the cause, and detailed the three primary demands:

1. Pension Updation as per the RBI model, 2. Regular Pension Revision in every wage settlement, akin to central government retirees. 3.Uniform DA for all retirees'

The programme saw enthusiastic support and felicitations from prominent leaders from various trade unions and pensioners' organisations. Their presence and powerful words reflected solidarity across sectors and boosted the morale of participants.

The concluding session of the Hunger Strike was gracefully led by Sri P V Rajendran, State President of Postal Department Retirees Association, who symbolically offered Lemon juice to Sri P P J Nair to mark the end of the hunger strike. The concluding session was presided over by Sri Krishnan Pathanath and Sri P Kumaran Nair proposed the vote of thanks, expressing

heartfelt gratitude to all comrades, leaders, volunteers, and media personnel who made the event a historic success.

The Hunger Strike at Kasaragod was not merely a protest but a voice of justice, echoing from the hearts of hundreds of retired bank officers who dedicated their prime years to nation-building. The overwhelming participation and wide support from civil society and trade unions have once again brought the spotlight on the legitimate and long-pending issues of bank retirees.

It is now the duty of the Government and IBA to respond with sensitivity and urgency to these voices — so that senior citizens may live the rest of their lives with dignity, security, and peace.

KOLKATA

A Hunger Strike Program was organized at Kolkata on 26th July, 2025 under the aegis of CBPRO, West Bengal State Committee to reiterate our long pending demand for Pension Updation and other lingering issues of retired Bank employees. This protest program was conducted as a part of the nationwide protest program being undertaken by the central committee of CBPRO, at large metros and state capitals across the country. The Kolkata protest meet was held in front of the Bengal Chamber of Commerce, in the busy financial and commercial hub of the city.

The weather was inclement and the city had seen huge downpour and waterlogging for the past two days. The police had barricaded off a section of the road from traffic to make space for the protesters. A section of the pavement and the dias was covered, but the larger portion of the protest area was open to sky. However, in spite of the inclement weather, retired bankers started to arrive at the spot quite early, in large numbers, filling up the protest area. People came from far and near. They came from far off districts of Purulia, Bankura, Malda, Murshidabad, Medinipur and many other places, besides the retirees from greater Kolkata. The total attendance exceeded 1,500.

Sri Nirmal Bari from Allahabad Bank welcomed the gathering and started the proceedings. One by one, the learned leaders graced the dias and shared their views, informing us about the reason for the protest meet, the issues, their past events and present status. Speakers like Sri Tridib Narayan Choudhury, President of AlBPARC state committee, Sri Suprita Sarkar, General Secretary, AlBPARC, Sri Ashok Dey from PNB Pensioners and Retired Association, Sri Subrata Sarkar from UCO Bank, Sri A R Rakshit from CBROA, Sri B Mukherjee from Bank of Baroda, Sri Dipak Basu from SBI, and many others including the leaders from Bangiyo Grameen Bikash Bank and others spoke on the occasion and enhanced the awareness about the burning and pending issues. The entire event was skilfully organised and conducted under the able

leadership of Sri Suprita Sarkar, General Secretary of AIBPARC who took care of the minutest details.

Members of the press were also present in the meet and it is expected that this will get the media coverage, as it rightly deserves. The Kolkata Police had made excellent arrangements for crowd and traffic control for the meeting in the busy traffic point. One of the protesters fell ill during the meeting, but was swiftly attended to and nursed back to normalcy.

The program ended at the afternoon with a hope that the issue will be settled by the concerned authorities.

ODISHA

31st July 2025: CBPRO Odisha Unit hunger strike attend by more than 400 comrades from across the state. Around 40 CBROA Odisha Unit Stalwarts participated today's hunger strike at Lower P M G Master canteen Bhubaneswar. Leaders are self-motivated to the cause of Pension Updation. We have made our points clear to the Government of India Ministry of Finance through Print media and electronic media that our demands are Just Demand. We want our pension updation in line with RBI only. Most of the senior citizens are super senior citizens are present on the venue in large numbers. We are deprived of our legitimate rights since 1995. In between 30 years passed and we are yet to receive the basic pension updated. The irony is we are spending 25 % of our pension towards paying the Health Insurance premium per anum. We want the Government to consider basic pension increase on the special allowance given during bipartite settlement immediately. We have paid homage to yesteryears senior citizens who left for heavenly abode in between.

The eventful Gathering was addressed by a host of Leaders of the Bank Retirees, including prominently Comrades Upendra Kumar Dash and Niranjan Jogania (the Joint Convenors of CBPRO, ODISHA), Ganesh Chandra Mishra (President of SBIPA, Odisha) and Amit K. Motayed (President of AIBPARC, Odisha).

If life is to live, Slit not, heal your woe. If death is inevitable, Fear not, embrace the flow."




A SECOND CHANCE

Where is South end circle in Bangalore? If you think it is in southern part of Bangalore, check again, maybe it was it was "South end" in 60s 70s when Jayanagar the sprawling locality

had not yet been developed. South End Circle is now no more in South end of Bangalore, but is in the heart of the City!

Where is North Road? If you are thinking about Yelahanka or Jalahalli or such other Northern part, sorry, it is a road from Ramakrishna Ashram to Lalbagh West gate of Basavanagudi a prominent area in the heart of City. It must have been on the then Northern part of old and prominent Basavanagudi decades ago and was 'North Road'! There is/was any South Road!

The West Chord Road or WCR was once like a ring road to the western 'end' of Bangalore. But now western part of Bangalore has grown so much that the West Chord Road is in the West, only in its name. Westren side is fast moving towards West.

If you are searching any location in Jayanagar, first you have to find out in which BLOCK it is located. But if you go little further down to J.P.Nagar there are PHASES, not BLOCKS like in Jayanagar. Of course plenty of roadblocks await you there! Not far off from Jayanagar is BANASHANKARI which has neither blocks nor phases but STAGES! First, Second and Third!

Bangalore also holds in it, PALYAs like Kalasi Palya, Sultan Palya, TC Palya may be once ruled by local Palegars (chieftains).

Wilson Garden is not a garden but a locality, where a Cemetery greets one, who goes in search of that elusive garden!

To cap it all Bengaluru had maximum number of Movie Theatres compared to any other city in India. In mid 80s there were more than 200 theatres. On Kempegowda Road alone there were 17 theatres, where movies of Indian Languages are screened. If you want to see an English movie, then rush to M G Road where there were 8 theatres solely for that purpose.

These are but only a few snippets about Bengaluru. But for GPS one would never be able to find where and how to reach one's destination! One can go on exploring Namma Bengaluru and the City never stops surprising with it's strange localities.
