





FROM THE DESK OF GENERAL SECRETARY



Dear Members/Associate Members,

Recently a Senior Official of Bank of Baroda, Baramati Branch in Maharashtra committed suicide by hanging himself in the branch premises. A death note recovered from the spot cited work pressure as the reason for the extreme step.

A Chief Manager of Union Bank in Gujarath hanged himself in February 2024, his suicide note blaming the work culture and workload. Two weeks later a branch Manager of UCO Bank in Tamil Nadu ended his life, reportedly due to work related pressures. Five instances of suicide by Bank Officials came to light in a single week in August 2023, two in April 2024 and one in May 2024, reportedly owing to stress and depression on account of high targets imposed on them.

In our Bank, Ms K Swapna, Manager of Thokkilangadi Branch in Dakshina Kannada District committed suicide citing stressful working conditions.

In the past 10 years, over 500 Officers / Managers of Public Sector Banks have died by suicide. These suicides have sent shock waves across the Banking industry.

What is pushing Public Sector Banks' Branch Managers/Officers over the brink? Following reasons are quoted for the unpleasant development.

Relentless pressure from the top Management without empathy and adequate support from the senior colleagues are leading to catastrophic consequences. Adding to the performance pressure is the toxic work culture in many Public Sector Banks. It is a deadly cocktail, which is killing motivation and creating manic depression.

In an environment where targets are overwhelming, Senior Management and customers are impatient and there is constant fear, not every banker is equipped with the resilience to survive and thrive.

Burnout, mental health issues and in some cases, the not-so-transparent policies on transfer and postings lead to depression.

We have interacted with many branch Managers of some banks across the country. Besides the issues mentioned above abusive superiors also seemed to be a reason for the Officers/Managers to commit suicide. Some video clips featuring such bosses are in the public domain. If we listen to their language, we will understand why temperatures run so high in a Bank Branch.

The troika of unrealistic targets, long working hours and lack of support from Seniors is affecting the work environment. It is not unusual to find the branch Managers trapped between the pressure to meet the targets.

The heart-breaking incidents have brought to light the growing burden of work pressure, unrealistic targets and mental stress among the Managers in Public Sector Banks. Officers across the country have been complaining for long about being overburdened with sales targets, insurance cross selling and back-to-back workload with little regards for their mental health or personal lives. The absence of adequate staffing, coupled with pressure from higher authorities has created an inhuman work culture that leaves Officers/Managers vulnerable to stress and burnout.

After recruitment freeze for several years till 2010, the Public Sector Banks began new recruitments when a new generation of young graduates joined the banks, who were then able to get quick promotions. But many of them do not get adequate training to handle the pressure and responsibilities of the Managerial post. This has hit their work-life balance.

The mergers of Public Sector Banks, the push towards privatisation, inadequate staff at the counter, expansion in duties and responsibilities of Officers/Managers and harassment from higher ups have led to a situation wherein Officers/Managers spend much of the day in office, late into the night.

A branch Manager informed that, he has almost lost track of the number of targets he has to meet. In addition to the traditional banking duties, a Manager is supposed to hit the target on a variety of Government Schemes from Jan Dhan Accounts and Mudra Loans to Atal Pension Yojana and even the distribution of FASTAGs for vehicles and profit targets from the sale of third party products including insurance schemes and Mutual Funds.

Reminders on various targets come as phone calls and WhatsApp messages constantly.

A top Bank Executive says, Banks should help Managers cope with stress through scientific stress management training and if needed encourage them to seek medical help. Stress at the workplace is a part of life of Bank Managers/Officers at all levels. The stigma associated with seeking professional help for depression, low feeling is the main issue. Stress and targets are here to stay whether we want it or not. Banks need to meet the expectations of customers in terms of service, of investors in terms of creating stock market value and of course, the targets set by the Management or even the Finance Ministry.

The Officers' Associations have been demanding that dignity and wellbeing of Officers and Managers must take precedence over numbers and profits.

Public Sector Banks have been playing a stellar role in the economic development of the country. It is time for soul searching. There is a need to change the culture. It is not a job the HR Department can do. The Boardrooms must look closely at what ails the Officers/Managers working

in branches, reassess business targets, ensure adequate staffing and extend mental health support before it is too late.

The country cannot afford to let its Public Sector banking system crumble under the weight of such internal dysfunction. Banks are not just financial intermediaries, they are instruments of social and economic justice. However, this mission cannot be sustained without protecting the dignity and wellbeing of those who serve it.

Urgent action is needed:

- Provide adequate staffing to branches. It is reported by the Union Finance Ministry that there are more than 41000 vacancies in clerical and Officer cadre.
- Provide mental health support. Establish counselling services, employee helpline and internal support mechanism.
- Promote a workplace culture that encourages Officers/Managers to seek help without fear of stigma or reprisal.
- Align workload with staffing. Staffing norms must be tailored to the size and function of branches. Arbitrary multi-tasking must be eliminated.
- Ensure Managerial accountability. Create transparent systems to address abuse of power.
- Disciplinary mechanism should be fair, impartial and open.
- Broaden performance metrics. Move beyond numeric targets. Reward quality of service, compassion, teamwork and resilience.

BEYOND APPEARANCE


People have their own story, struggles, pains and nuances,

My elder brother yelled at me “hey, the Sun has risen so much above, it is getting late to school, hurry up”! No one in our Village had a watch in those days, early 1950s. The level of the Sun rising in the morning sky was our wall clock! And the shadow length of house walls against the rising sun were our time keepers! Grabbing the books in our hands we used to march to our school two and a half miles away in the nearby town. Other boys used to join us en route. We had one compulsory stop midway. Invariably we all used to stop at the Hanuman temple at the outskirts of the town. It was open round the clock. No doors no locks, always free to access Hanuman. More than the quick namaskar to Hanuman, it was the lure of half peeled bananas offered at the feet of deity which compelled us to stop by. In a few seconds the bananas made their way into our hungry stomachs. Occasionally though, it was dry dates offered at the Hanuman’s feet, which made our day memorable. Elder boys who were accompanying us used to pocket coins offered without the slightest fear of Monkey God! They always shared with us “Nimbe huli” peppermint bought out of the coins pocketed by them!


Once our School bell rang for the day, we all were sprinting back home. But this return journey had too many stops and deviations too. En route we virtually had a “field day “! Throwing stones at Tamarind trees to get tamarind pods, both raw and half ripe (Dorey kaayi in Kannada), which we used to lick leisurely. Some boys used to bring salt to prepare round balls of tamarind pulp by pounding tamarind pulp and salt on stone slabs on sideways of the road! We went on sipping the sour balls till something different caught our eyes en route. We used to invade harvested fields of groundnut like monkeys. Moving one leg in a rotational manner into the harvested soil we used to dig out a few left over ground nut pods from the field. Occasionally, Lucky ones amongst us used to get a pod of three seeds, when all of us gathered around him to see his lucky strike! Deseeding pods, still wet and soil, we were never bothered even if a little soil went inside our stomachs along with ground nut seeds. Our other ventures were fields with

okra (ladies finger) onions and tomatoes. We used to munch them all till we were shouted at and shooed us out by the farm owners.

If nothing, we were happy to pluck wild red cactus fruits grown on the fences outlining farms. After carefully removing the thorny seed inside those fruits, we enjoyed by savouring the sweet ripe pulp. We were happy to pluck thulasi leaves too, grown in plenty by roadside and eat them like goats!

Each day was different and thrilling as the changing seasons of nature offered variety of options to fill our hungry stomachs.

Looking back, I wonder, are we not missing out the joy of journey while hurrying towards our destination?






