## FROM THE DESK OF GENERAL SECRETARY



**Dear Members/Associate Members,**

The world celebrated yet another May Day or International Workers' Day on 1st May, 2026. May Day originated as a commemoration of the 1886 Haymarket labour unrest in Chicago, USA, where workers agitated for an 8 hour working day, faced violent police confrontation. On May 1, 1886 hundreds of thousands of workers across USA walked off their jobs to protest against 12 to 15 hour workdays, demanding an 8-hour workday. The protest in Chicago Haymarket Square turned violent after a bomb was thrown, leading to fatalities among police and workers. This led to subsequent trial and execution of strike leaders. These individuals came to be known as martyrs of the Labour movement and their sacrifice is honoured by celebrating May 1 as the International Labour Day. As industrialisation increased in the early 19th Century, workers began to organise

themselves into trade unions to demand humane working conditions and by 1837 the then President of the USA, declared a 10-hour workday for the Government workers. This 10-hour workday was however, not universal and the struggle to make it universal continued for the next few decades.

In the 1850s, this demand gradually evolved into the more radical and widely embraced call for an eight-hour workday. The impact of this demand extended beyond the United States as workers in Australia and other countries struggled for the same. In 1856 Australian stonemasons, won an 8-hour workday. By the 1860s this demand gained influential backing when delegates from various trade unions gathered in Baltimore to form the National Labour Union in the United States. The National Labour Union sought to unify workers across trades and passed a Resolution at their Inaugural meeting in 1866, declared that the workday would be a maximum of 8 hours across all states. The National Labour Union slowly disintegrated but it laid the foundation for a broader Labour movement. That year the Geneva Congress of the First International endorsed the demand for an eight-hour workday.

The call for a shorter workday became only a small part of what May Day came to represent. The Federation of Organised Trades and Labour Unions of the USA and Canada (which later became the American Federation of Labour) passed a resolution in 1884 declaring that from May 1, 1886 eight hours would constitute a day's Labour. This set a deadline and a nationwide call for action. The Federation also called for an organised mass strike on May 1, 1886. The cause drew as many as 5,00,000 workers including many unskilled and previously unorganised workers involved in about 1,500 strikes. The movement became widespread across major cities in the United States and was centred in Chicago, where the strike became especially hostile in Haymarket Square. What began as a continuation of peaceful demonstration, soon turned into a violent confrontation with police.

In 1889, the Second International - a Federation of Socialist Groups and Trade Unions, declared May 1st as a Day in support of workers, in commemoration of the martyrs of the Haymarket riot in Chicago. It also declared May 1st an International holiday to honour the martyrs. It became a global symbol of Labour rights in 1889, chosen to honour workers' struggles for better working conditions.

May 1st marks Labour Day, honouring workers' vital role in economic development and development of the society. The day highlights rights and dignity and fair treatment of workers. Labour Day serves as a celebration of progress and a reminder of ongoing efforts for fairness and respect for all the workers across the globe. From factory floors to Corporate Offices, the occasion serves as a reminder of the rights, dignity and value of Labour.

May Day became a significant day for workers' Solidarity, adopted by many nations and socialist movements worldwide, particularly popular in Europe, Russia, Asia and Latin America.

Labour Day or May Day in India was first celebrated on May 1st, 1923 in Chennai (then Madras) organised by Mylapuram Singaravelu Chettiar of the Labour Kisan Party of Hindustan. He initiated the celebration by demanding workers' rights, reasonable working hours and a national holiday, also hoisting the red flag for the first time in India

In today's fast changing world, the meaning of Labour Day has expanded to include discussions around work life balance, mental health and fair opportunities in digital economies.

#### LABOUR DAY 2026 THEME.

Labour Day 2026 broadly centres on the idea of dignity of Labour, inclusive growth and the workers' well bring in a changing economy. With the rise of automation, gig workers and remote employment, the focus this year is also on adapting Labour protection to modern work places.

Labour Day stands as both a celebration and a reminder, a celebration of how far workers' rights have come and a reminder of the work still needed to be done. As economies evolve, the principles behind May Day remain constant, fairness, dignity and respect for every worker. In a country like India, where millions, both in the organised and unorganised sector, contribute across diverse sectors every day, Labour Day is not just symbolic- it is essential.

Labour Day is not just a Public holiday. It reflects a deeper message.

-It acknowledges the backbone of economic growth, the work force.

-It raises awareness about workers' rights and protections.

-It calls attention to challenges like wage gaps, job insecurity and work place safety.

Happy Labour Day. Salute to every worker who builds our world with dedication and hard work.

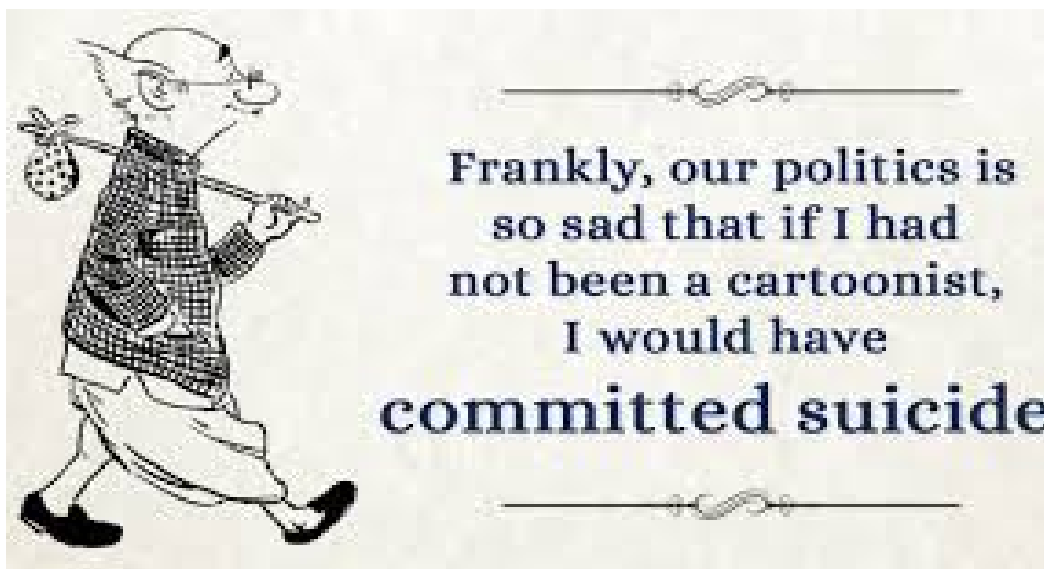
## **VIJAYAWADA**

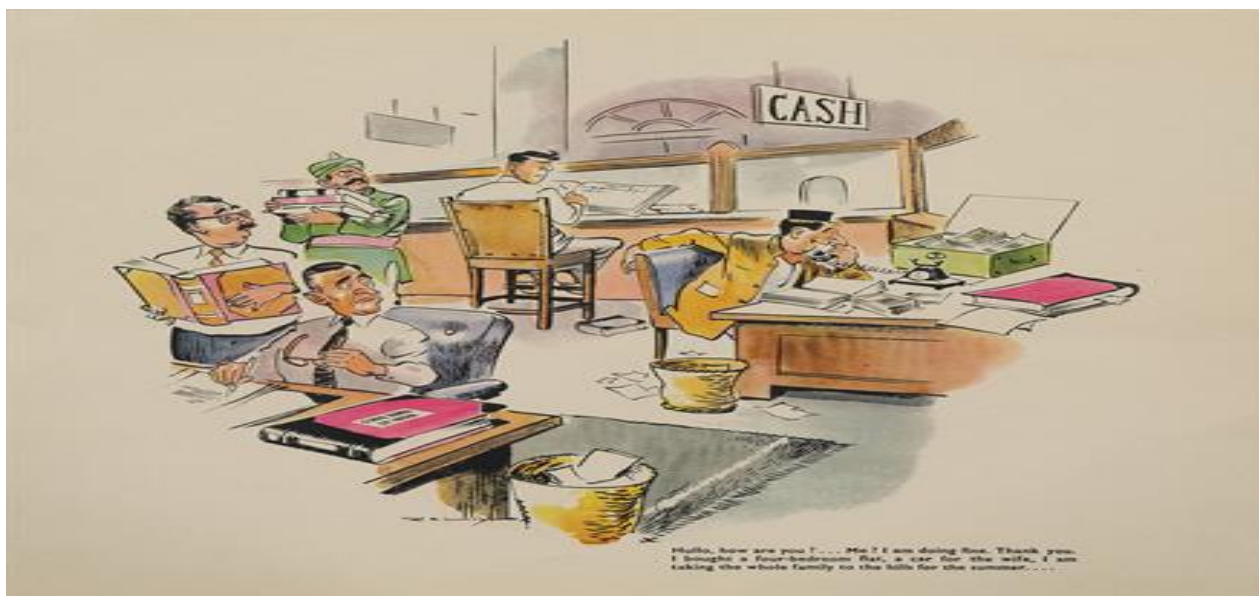

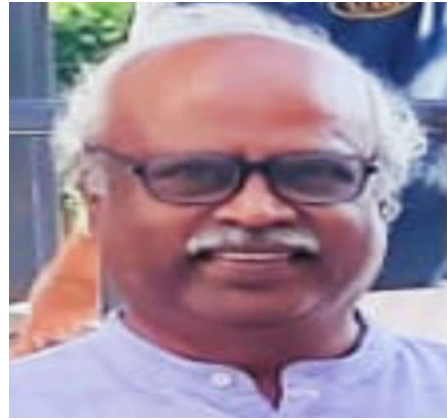
POEM By: Arun Sunder Raj, Mem No. 4857

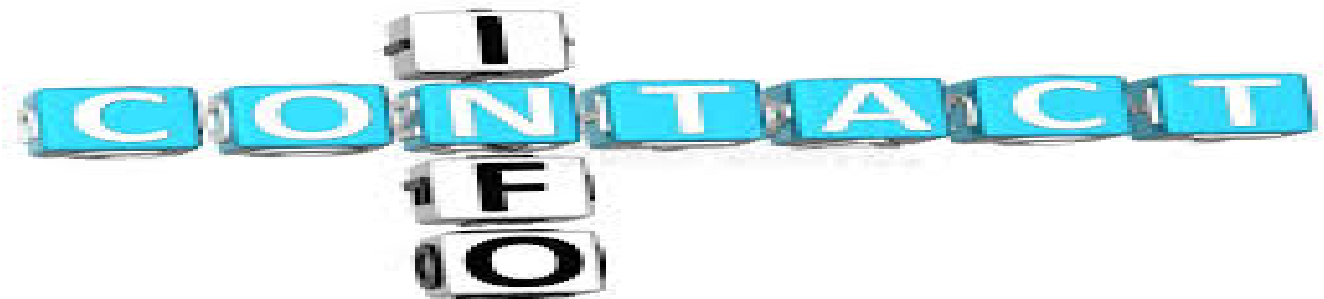
