FROM THE DESK OF GENERAL SECRETARY



Dear Members/Associate Members,

19TH JULY: BANK NATIONALISATION DAY

India's Banking Sector witnessed a landmark transformation on July 19, 1969, when 14 major commercial Banks were nationalised through the Banking Companies (Acquisition and Transfer of Undertakings) Act, 1970. Spearheaded by the then Prime Minister, this significant reform was followed by a second phase of nationalisation in April 1980, during which 6 additional Banks came under Government ownership. Collectively these actions reshaped the structure of Indian Banking and established Public Sector Banks as dominant players in the financial landscape. As a result, around 80% of the sector's total assets came

under state control, creating one of the world's largest Government owned Banking systems.

The rationale behind nationalising Banks was deeply embedded in India's broader developmental goals. One key objective was to promote financial inclusion by expanding access to Banking services in rural and semi-urban areas that had long been ignored by profit-driven private Banks. The Prime goal was to channel credit towards priority sectors such as Agriculture, small-scale industries and exports that were critical to economic development but lacked sufficient access to institutional financing. Additionally, the move aimed to bridge Regional disparities in economic growth by ensuring a more equitable distribution of Banking services, particularly in economically backward regions and states.

Since nationalisation Public Sector Banks have become the cornerstone of India's financial system. Despite recent declines in market share, they still manage roughly 60% of the sector's total assets. The expansion of their branch network from 8,262 branches in 1969 to more than 90,000 branches today, has played a crucial role in mobilising savings from even the most remote parts of the country and redirecting them into productive investments. This extensive reach has enabled Public Sector Banks to facilitate the implementation of a wide array of Government initiatives, from direct benefit transfers to Agricultural Credit Schemes, effectively making them the main financial link for millions of Indians. Beyond conventional Banking, Public Sector Banks have served as vital tools for executing socio-economic policies, financing development priorities, and maintaining financial stability during global crises. Their contribution to infrastructure development, poverty alleviation, and employment generation have made them essential to India's growth narrative over the past more than five decades. In times of economic distress such as the 2008 global financial crisis and the COVID-19 pandemic Public Sector Banks exhibited resilience and continued lending when private Institutions grew risk-averse, thus playing a key role in cushioning the economy from deeper recessions.

During the period 1969 to 2024 Public Sector Banks' growth journey is reflected in an exponential growth of Deposits from Rs.4,600/- crore in 1969 to Rs.120 lakh crore in 2024 a staggering 26,087 fold increase

The exponential growth in credit disbursement between 1969 to 2024, from a modest Rs.3,400/- crore in 1969 to Rs.85 lakh crore in 2024 indicates that Banking credit has scaled in line with India's development trajectory. This dramatic rise reflects more than just macroeconomic growth, it underscores the impact of policy reforms, financial inclusion initiatives, technological progress and the evolution of both corporate and retail lending markets.

Banking penetration in India from 1969 to 2024 captures one of the most significant financial inclusion transformations in the world. In 1969, less than 20% of the population had access to formal Banking. Over the next four decades, progress was incremental with penetrative rising to about 45% by 2010. The turning point came in 2014 with the launch of the Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana which revolutionised financial access through zero-balance accounts, digital infrastructure, directed benefit transfers, and bundled services such as insurance and pensions. In just 10 years Banking coverage soared from 53% to around 90%, surpassing the cumulative gains of the prior 40 years. By 2024 India had reduced its unbanked population from 80% to just 10%, signalling not only a statistical milestone but a fundamental reshaping of the financial ecosystem, expanding economic inclusion, reducing informality and enhancing Public service delivery.

Developments in 2026:

Public Sector Banks recorded one of their strongest financial performances during FY 2025-2026, supported by robust credit growth, improved profitability and major governance reforms.

***Record business growth:** Aggregate business reached Rs.283.3 lakh crore as on 31st March,2026, registering 12.8% annual growth. Deposits increased with 10.65% growth, while gross advances rose 15.7% year on year.

***Strong support to productive sectors:** Retail Advances grew 18.1% Agriculture advances 15.5% and MSME Advances 18.2% highlighting Public Sector Banks' role in entrepreneurship, financial inclusion and broad based economic development.

***Historic achievement in Asset Quality:** Gross NPA Declined to 1.93%, Net NPA to 0.49%, provisioning coverage remained above 90% in every Public Sector Bank, slippage ratio reduced to 0.7% and recoveries including written off accounts reached Rs.86,971 crore.

***Major Achievements:** Aggregate operating profit reached Rs.3.21 lakh crore, while net profit rose 11.1% to around record Rs 1.98 lakh crore, marking the fourth consecutive year of overall profitability. Aggregate CRAR improved to 16.6% supported by Rs.50,551 crore capital raising, well above the regulatory requirements of 11.5%.

***Digital Transformation and Governance Reforms:** Public Sector Banks expanded paper less lending through e-KYC, Digital documentation, Straight Through Processing (STP), Government Platform integration, stronger cyber security, improved operational efficiency and citizen centric Banking services.

***Governance and Financial inclusion initiatives:**

The Department of Financial Services reviewed Public Sector Banks' performance across Governance, financial inclusion and digital banking. "Your money, your

right" campaign helped return of over Rs.6,800 crore of unclaimed financial assets to nearly 29 lakh rightful claimants, while digital Public service delivery was strengthened through an upgraded multilingual Department of Financial Services portal.

Challenges before the Public Sector Banks:

Despite major improvements, Public Sector Banks in India continue to face structural, operational and emerging challenges while balancing commercial objectives with developmental responsibilities.

***Managing Stressed Assets:** Although gross NPA declined to 1.93% and Net NPA to 0.39% by 31st March, 2026, maintaining high assets quality requires continuous monitoring and prudent lending.

***Competition from Private Sector Banks:** Private Sector Banks continue to lead in innovation, customer experience and digital services, requiring Public Sector Banks to accelerate technological modernisation.

***Cyber Security Risks:** Growing digital banking adoption increases exposure to cyber threats, making stronger cyber resilience and operational risk management essential priorities.

***Operational Efficiency:** Continuous improvement in cost management, productivity and governance remains necessary despite the cost to income ratio improving to 49.67% during FY 2025-26.

***Global Economic Uncertainties:** International geopolitical developments, including disruptions in the Middle East require, Public Sector Banks to remain financially resilient and maintain adequate risk preparedness.

***Strengthening Customer Services:** Faster grievances redressal, responsible digital lending, transparent Banking practices and wider financial literacy remain important for maintaining Public confidence.

India's Public Sector Banks have thus remained indispensable to the country's economic and social transformation, serving as pillars of financial inclusion, developmental finance, and crisis resilience. Over the decades, PSBs have bridged rural-urban divides, empowered marginalised populations, and facilitated national priorities through expansive branch networks, tailored financial products and the implementation of flagship Government schemes. Despite facing significant challenges, such as the NPA Crisis, rising competition, and digital disruption PSBs have demonstrated remarkable adaptability through co-ordinated reforms, recapitalisation, technological modernization and strategic mergers. These efforts have improved their assets quality, operational efficiency and governance standards, allowing them to maintain systemic relevance in an increasingly competitive environment. PSBs have not only driven credit flow into Agriculture, NSMEs and infrastructure, but also catalysed employment, human capital development and social mobility. Their resilience during global crises like

the global financial downturn in 2008 and the COVID-19 pandemic underscores their critical role in ensuring economic stability. As India's financial ecosystem evolves, PSBs stand at a transformative juncture balancing Public objectives with market efficiency. By aligning commercial imperatives with inclusive development, PSBs are poised to remain Central to India's vision of equitable, sustainable and broad based economic growth.

Dear Sirs, I am S Sivasubramanian (13616), Manager (Retd.), Canara Bank, living in Nanganallur, Chennai. I am a Life Member of CBROA (LM No. 3273). I suffered a heart attack in Feb. 2025 and was admitted to a non-empanelled hospital. Because of my condition, I was kept under observation (in ICU) for some days

and then CABG was performed for DVD. On discharge, I submitted my claim to Raksha (TPA of NIC). Total claim amount was about Rs. 7.83 lakh. BUT, TPA sanctioned Rs. 177700/- only. When I took up the matter with CBROA friends in Chennai and your good self, I was suggested to make my representation to NIC with the help of **Shri Satish Kumar Ghai, DGS** from Dehradun. I was also given his number.

When I contacted him, he was too willing to help. He got full papers and details from me and drafted a representation. I submitted the same. After some follow up, NIC sanctioned further Rs. 170255/-. Not satisfied with this also, Shri Ghai suggested that we can prefer a complaint with "The Insurance Ombudsman." As per his guidance and taking drafts from him, I preferred the complaint with the Ombudsman, Chennai in July 2025. It was taken up on record in Sep. 2025 and numbered. I was called for online hearing on 19-02-2026. After making follow ups as suggested by Shri Ghai (including personal visits to Ombudsman office), I finally got the AWARD last night.

The Ombudsman has allowed my case on merits and sanctioned me the full eligible amount under the Policies. They have directed NIC to pay the full amount within 30 days. I sincerely thank the CBROA for suggesting me to take up my case/claim through Shri Ghai. I also sincerely thank Shri Ghai for his personal interest in my case and doing everything needed to get a good & positive result. At every stage, he helped me a lot by guiding me and suggesting the next step. Once again I thank your goodselfs, CBROA and Shri Satish Kumar Ghai for the timely and needy help extended to me in getting my claim settled in full.

With empathy, concern and warmth.

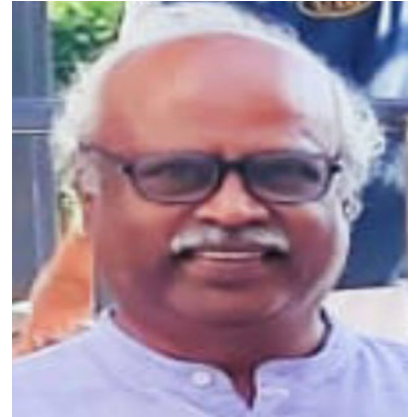

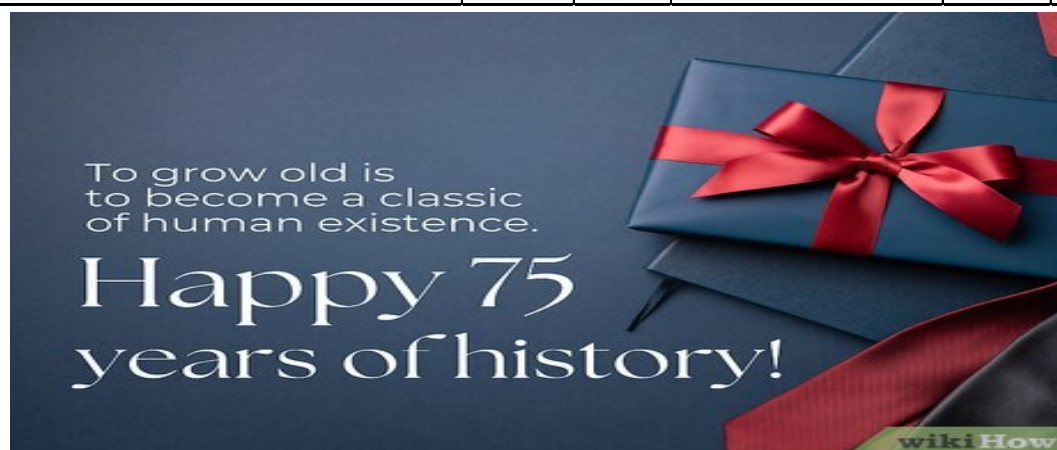

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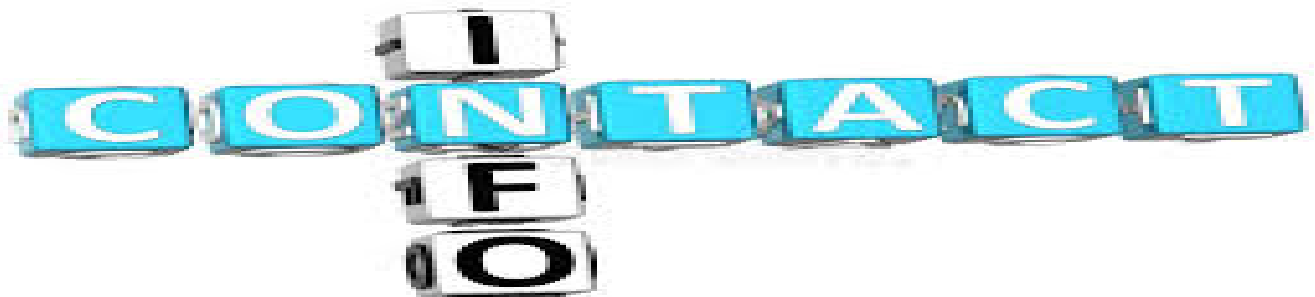
