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FROM THE DESK OF GENERAL SECRETARY



Dear Members and Associate Members,

"Long years ago we made a tryst with destiny, and now the time comes when we shall redeem our pledge, not wholly or in full measure, but very substantially. At the stroke of the midnight hour, when the world sleeps, India will awake to life and freedom". - Pandith Jawaharlal Nehru.

The 15th of August, 1947 marks a notable struggle to reclaim the power to freedom and independence. It was a struggle so remarkable that it soared a sense of patriotism and rediscover one's motherland in every soul that went on to live on the lush lands of this powerful nation. The freedom struggle for more than

100 years showed to the world that independence is not just the state of freedom, it is a tool that steers one to feel the power again, the power to hope again, grow again free from the shackles of the colonial rulers.

With the country burning down to flames of atrocities and terror, many valiant freedom fighters across the country stood to fight against the imperialistic rule they were being put through. "Will do or die" echoed throughout, uniting the unrest Indians to fight against the atrocities they had to endure. Notable nationalists including Mahatma Gandhi, Balagangadhar Tilak, Sardar Vallabhabhai Patel, Babu Rajendra Prasad, Subhaschandra Bose, Jawaharlal Nehru and many more led significant movements against the British Raj. The Champaran Sathyagraha, the Dandi March and the Non-co-operation movement are just a few of the long list of struggles that went down to revolutionize, India's long struggle for independence from the Britishers. However, these righteous movements were met with the deaths of millions of innocent civilians, flagging this to be one of the darkest times of India's history. Nevertheless, none were deterred by the atrocities perpetrated by the Britishers and mother India's freedom was their ultimate goal, as freedom was necessary for prosperous growth and the sustenance of the generations that succeeded them. Indians fought back, with every breath devoted to winning back their power to live as they pleased. After 90 years of battle, India once again embraced the breeze of freedom.

Today, Indians around the world unite to celebrate the 79th year of freedom parading to the world their reason to smile at how far the country has moved forward.

The significance of the freedom struggle is reflected in the fact that it was not limited to being an influential turning point in India's history, but it went on to inspire other revolutionary movements of freedom all around the world, laying out a blueprint for decolonization.

The India that awakened to freedom in 1947 was burdened by poverty, illiteracy, disease and the enormous human tragedy of partition. Its economy was weak, its Institutions were young and many outside observers doubted whether such a vast, diverse and desperately poor country could survive as a functioning democracy. Yet India survived. More than that it advanced.

It built Democratic Institutions, and held elections after election. It established universities, laboratories, industries and scientific research centres. It achieved remarkable progress in Agriculture and food production, it created a formidable scientific and technological establishment, developed Nuclear and space capabilities, produced generations of doctors, engineers, scientists, teachers and entrepreneurs and eventually emerged as one of the world's major economies.

Today, Indian scientists send Mission to the moon and Mars and study the Sun. Indian technology professionals occupy important positions across the world. Indian doctors serve humanity in almost every continent. Indian entrepreneurs have created enterprises of global significance. Indians had built some of the world's most influential Institutions and corporations.

That achievement should inspire pride. But anniversaries must do more than invite celebration. But they should also invite reflection.

On this solemn occasion we pay homage to the freedom fighters whose bravery and dedication secured India's sovereignty. Their struggle reminds us that freedom is a privilege earned through struggle not a gift bestowed. The day also reflects on India's progress - economic growth, technological development, innovation and social reforms that have transformed the nation since 1947.

Finally, its significance shines through its ability to unite people from diverse regions and professions in a shared celebration of national identity. It fosters a sense of pride and duty, encouraging every individual to uphold the values of democracy and justice.

The celebration must be accompanied by introspection.

There remain millions for whom the promise of independence has not yet translated fully into a life of dignity and opportunity. Economic inequality remains painfully visible. Extraordinary wealth exists alongside desperate poverty. Magnificent urban developments can stand within sight of Settlements where families struggle for Basic sanitation, Healthcare, education and secure livelihoods. Social divisions - of caste, class, religion, gender and region - continue to wound the idea of equal Citizenship. Too many Indians still encounter indignity because of who they are, where they were born, what they believe, how

little they possess or where they stand in the social hierarchy. No economic ranking can make these realities irrelevant.

India is rightly proud of its economic rise. It should aspire to greater prosperity. Growth is indispensable; without wealth creation, no nation can sustainably finance education, Healthcare, infrastructure, employment or social welfare.

But economic growth must never become an end in itself. The purpose of an economy is ultimately to improve human life.

A country cannot be considered truly rich merely because its GDP has risen, if millions of its citizens remain deprived of dignity, opportunity and basic security. Nor should human beings be regarded simply as instruments for producing economic growth.

Indeed, the opposite is closer to the truth: human beings are the engines of economic progress. Invest in them. Educate them. Keep them healthy. Protect their freedoms. Give their children opportunities. Allow their talents to flourish. Treat their Labour with respect. Ensure that justice is accessible regardless of wealth or influence. Protect the dignity of the weekend citizens carefully as the privilege of the most powerful.

Do that, and economic progress will acquire something even more valuable: human meaning.

India's ancient traditions celebrated knowledge and inquiry. Its modern achievements demonstrate what India can accomplish when education, opportunity and scientific temperament come together. The task of the coming decades must therefore be to extend those opportunities more widely.

The child in a poor village deserves the chance to become a scientist.
The daughter of a Labourer deserves the opportunity to become a physician.
The street vendor deserves respect from the state.
The farmer deserves security and dignity.
The worker who builds India's cities deserves a share in India's prosperity.

And every Indian irrespective of religion, caste, gender, language, region or economic standing deserves the assurance that the Constitution's magnificent opening words, **"We the People"** include them without qualification.

On this 80th independence day, Robert Frost's celebrated words seem particularly appropriate. **"And miles to go before I sleep."**

India has travelled from colonial subjugation to sovereignty, from widespread hunger towards food security, from limited industrial capacity to technological ambition; from modest scientific infrastructure to Missions in space, from economic weakness to a place among the world's largest economies. These are not small accomplishments. They belong not merely to one Government or one political party but to generations of Indians who waited, struggled, dreamed and built.

Yet there are miles to go.

Let Indians everywhere celebrate the extraordinary journey of eighty years. Let us remember with gratitude those who sacrificed for freedom and those countless citizens- farmers, workers, teachers, scientists, soldiers, doctors, entrepreneurs, artists, civil servants and ordinary families- who built independent India.

But when the celebrations are over and the flags are carefully folded, key India's leaders must remember the first three words in whose name they exercise power.

"We, the People."

Put the people above political calculations. Put their dignity above statistics. Put education, health, justice and opportunity alongside economic ambition. Measure national greatness not only by how high India ranks among the economies of the world, but also by how deeply the benefits of that rise have reached the lives of ordinary Indians.

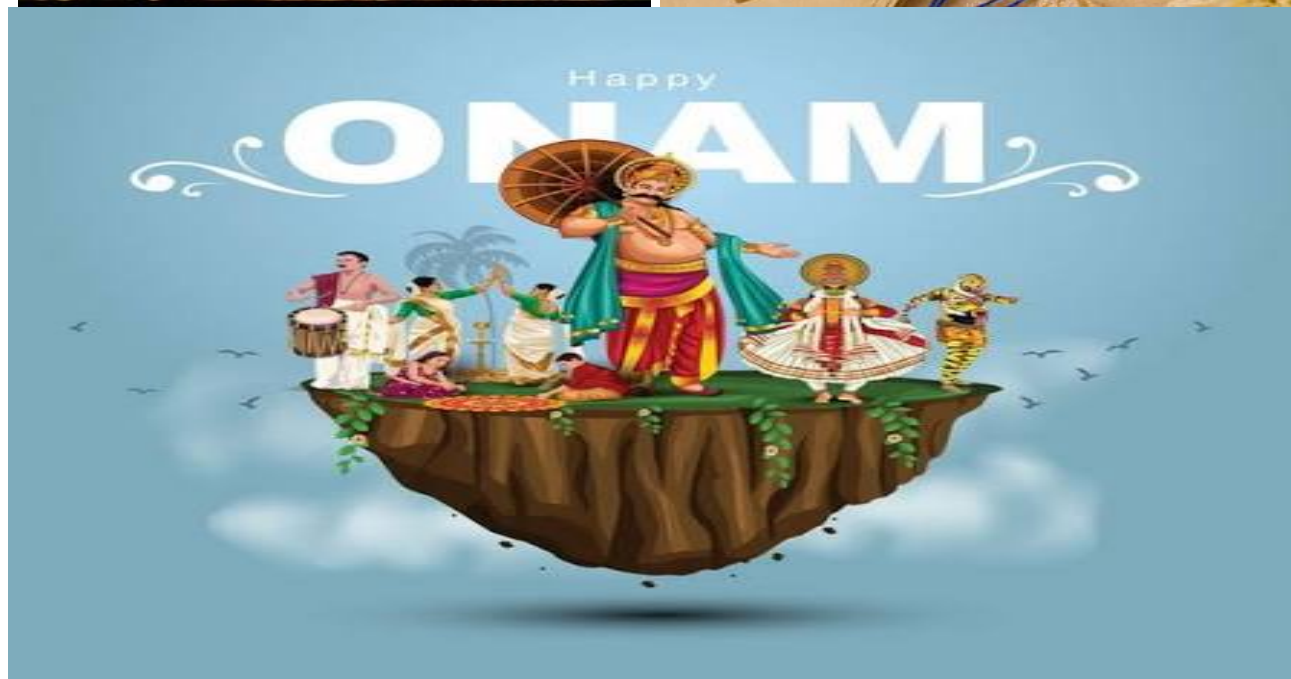
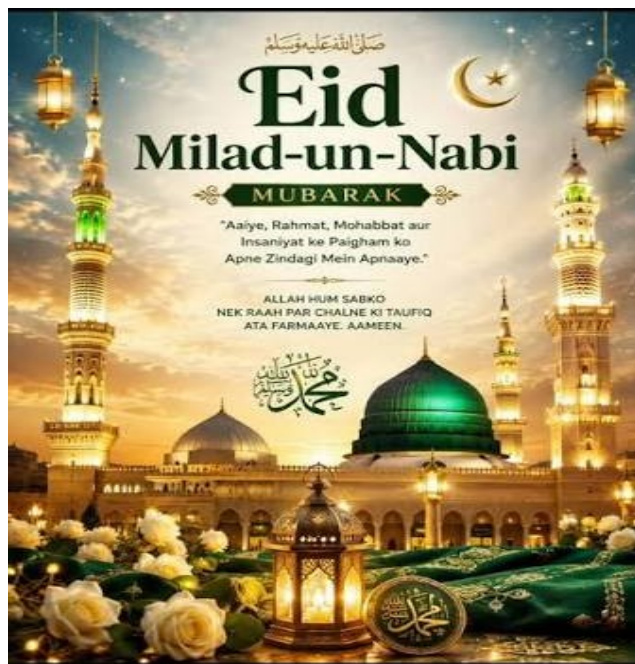

DELHI REGION:

PLANT A PLANT TO SAVE THE PLANET; GIVE A SAFER AND CLEANER ENVIRONMENT TO POSTERITY

All India Bank Pensioners and Retirees Confederation (AIBPARC), Delhi State Unit undertook a programme to Plant a Plant to Save the Planet and Give a Safer and Cleaner Environment to the Posterity in the National Capital City of Delhi on 19.07.2026 to celebrate the completion of 57 Years of the Nationalisation of 14 Major Banks in the Country. JHARKHAND REGION

KERALA STATE

The Joint Convenors of AKBRF, BEFI, NCBE and AIBPARC met online on 5 July 2026 at 7.00 p.m. to finalise the programme for the observance of Bank Nationalisation Day. Representatives of all the four organisations participated in the deliberations and discussed various forms of agitation that could effectively draw the attention of the public, the media and the authorities to the long-pending demands of bank retirees, particularly pension updation and other related issues. Among the programmes considered were dharnas in front of banks, human chains, relay hunger strikes, candlelight protests and evening demonstrations.

Taking into account the prevailing weather conditions and the need to ensure maximum participation of both retirees and serving employees, the meeting unanimously resolved to organise a Dharna-cum-Demonstration at Kanhangad as follows: Date: 16 July 2026, Time: 5.00 p.m.

Venue: SBI Complex, Kunnumel, Kottachery, Kanhangad

The programme will commence immediately after banking hours so that serving employees can also participate conveniently. All retirees are requested to assemble at the venue well before the scheduled time.

Leaders representing all the four organisations will address the gathering. It was also unanimously decided to extend a cordial invitation to all serving bank employees of the area, irrespective of their organisational or union affiliation, to participate in this united programme in the larger interest of the banking fraternity. The Joint Convenors expressed their happiness that, for the first time, AIBPARC is joining hands with BEFI and NCBE in observing Bank Nationalisation Day. The meeting placed on record its heartfelt appreciation to the State leadership, especially the State Secretary and his team, for taking the initiative to build this broad-based unity among retirees' and employees' organisations.

The following representatives attended the meeting: Sri K. V. Kumaran – AKBRF, Smt. Jisha Krishnan – NCBE, Sri Prakash – NCBE, Sri Sreejith – NCBE, Sri K. Raghavan – BEFI Sri P. Y. Sreedharan – AIBPARC & Sri P. P. J Nair – AIBPARC. The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks proposed by Smt. Jisha Krishnan.

Nationalisation Day Observed as "Demand Day" and "Bank Pensioners' Betrayal Day" at KASARAGOD

Bank Nationalisation Day was observed in a unique and historic manner at Kanhangad on 16 July 2026, with a Dharna-cum-Demonstration jointly organised by AIBPARC, AKBRF, NCBE and BEFI in front of the SBI Regional Office Complex, Kunnumel, Kottachery. The programme marked the first-ever joint observance of Nationalisation Day in the district by organisations representing both serving employees and retirees. A large number of bank employees affiliated to NCBE and BEFI, along with retirees, participated, making the programme a powerful demonstration of unity.

The speakers observed that, while Bank Nationalisation transformed India's banking system and contributed immensely to national development, bank retirees have been denied pension updation for decades. Having received not even a single revision in basic pension, retirees now observe the day not merely as a celebration but also as "Demand Day" and "Bank Pensioners' Betrayal Day."

The meeting was presided over by Sri P. P. J Nair. Smt. Jisha Krishnan, District Secretary of NCBE, welcomed the gathering with an inspiring address, recalling the achievements of Bank Nationalisation and assuring NCBE's wholehearted support to the just demands of bank retirees. She also highlighted major issues affecting serving employees, including five-day banking, staff shortages, recruitment, opposition to privatisation and protection of labour rights.

In his presidential address, Sri P. P. J Nair stressed the need for a united movement of serving employees and retirees to secure pension updation, protect

Public Sector Banks, implement five-day banking, improve family pension, ensure affordable medical insurance and resist privatisation and outsourcing.

The Dharna was inaugurated by Sri C. P. Narendran, State Joint General Secretary of ALBRF. Sri K. Raghavan (BEFI), Sri Prakash (NCBE) and Sri P. Kumaran Nair (AKBRF) also addressed the gathering, reiterating their commitment to defend Public Sector Banks and secure justice for employees and retirees.

The programme concluded with a resolve to strengthen the united movement for pension justice and to safeguard the values and legacy of Bank Nationalisation.

DAKSHINA KANNADA UNIT

On 19th July, AIBPARC, DK Unit & Vijaya Bank Retired Officers Association jointly conducted "plant a plant and save the planet" programme at Vijaya Mangala layout at Bajpe. 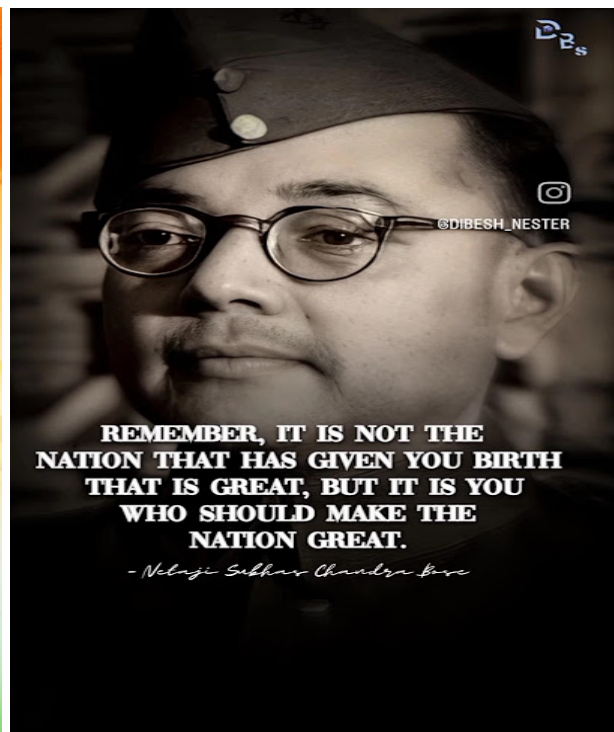
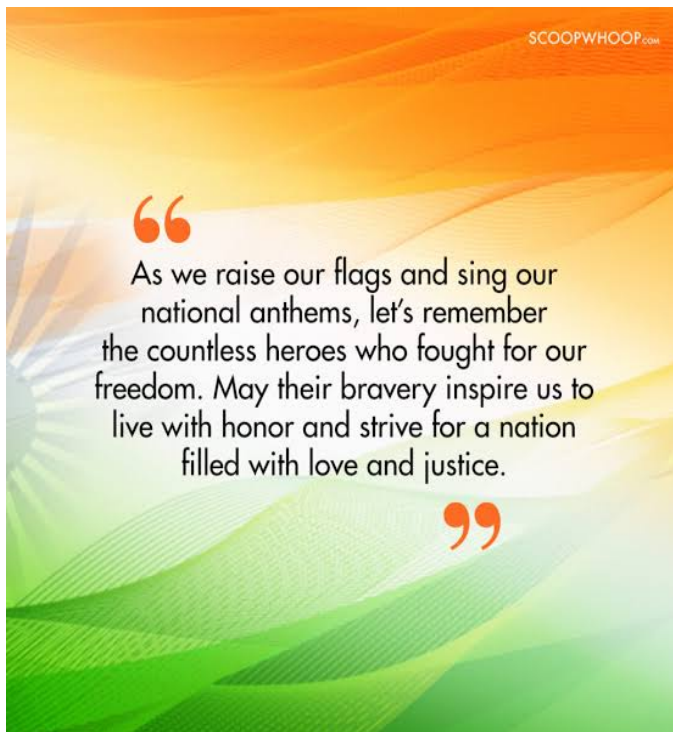

Sir Garfield Sobers — The Cricketer Who Could Do Everything: A tribute to one of cricket's greatest sons



The cricketing world has lost one of its most extraordinary figures.

Sir Garfield St Aubrun Sobers, universally known as Garry Sobers, passed away on 17 July 2026 at the age of 89. With his passing, cricket has lost not merely a great batsman, a great bowler or a great fielder, but a cricketer who seemed capable of mastering almost every aspect of the game. For generations of cricket lovers, Sobers represented the very ideal of the complete cricketer.

He could bat with elegance and power, bowl left-arm spin or left-arm pace, field brilliantly and lead his country. At a time when specialization was far less common than it is today, Sobers could genuinely change a match in several different ways.

The International Cricket Council describes him as one of the greatest all-rounders ever to play the game. His numbers explain why.

In 93 Test matches for the West Indies between 1954 and 1974, Sobers scored 8,032 runs at an extraordinary average of 57.78 and took 235 wickets. He was also an outstanding fielder.

But statistics alone cannot adequately describe Garry Sobers.

The 365 that became legendary: Perhaps the innings most closely associated with Sobers came in 1958 against Pakistan. At just 21 years of age, he scored 365 not out in Kingston. At the time, it was the highest individual score ever made in Test cricket. It remained the world record for 36 years, until Brian Lara scored 375 in 1994. Think about that for a moment.

A young man of 21 had produced an innings so extraordinary that nobody could surpass it for more than three decades. And this was not the peak of his career. It was only the beginning of what would become one of cricket's most remarkable careers.

More than a batsman, What separated Sobers from the great batsmen of his era was his extraordinary versatility. He could bowl left-arm orthodox spin, wrist spin and left-arm fast-medium bowling. The ICC records his 235 Test wickets at an average of 34.03.

Imagine having a batsman capable of scoring runs at an average of nearly 58 and then, when the captain needed a breakthrough, being able to turn to him as a genuine bowler. And he was not merely a part-time bowler. He could be a frontline bowler. That is why the word all-rounder hardly seems sufficient when describing him.

Six sixes in an over: Then came another moment that became part of cricketing folklore. In 1968, while playing for Nottinghamshire against Glamorgan, Sobers hit six consecutive sixes in an over from Malcolm Nash. He became the first batsman to achieve this extraordinary feat in first-class cricket. Today, with Twenty20 cricket and power hitting commonplace, six sixes in an over may seem less unbelievable to younger audiences. But in 1968, it was almost unthinkable.

The captain: Sobers was not only an individual genius. He also carried the responsibility of leading the West Indies. He became captain in 1965, succeeding the great Frank Worrell. Under Sobers, the West Indies continued to establish themselves as a formidable force in international cricket. His captaincy was adventurous and instinctive. He was prepared to take risks and play attacking cricket. Perhaps the most famous example came in the 1968 Test against England at Barbados, when he made the controversial decision to declare the West Indies innings closed while he himself was on 150. The decision ultimately allowed England to chase a relatively modest target and the match ended in one of Test cricket's most dramatic ties. That episode tells us something about Sobers. He was prepared to take risks in pursuit of victory.

A cricketer without boundaries : He was admired in England, Australia, India and wherever cricket was played.

The respect of his peers: Great cricketers are often judged by statistics. Great sportsmen are also judged by the respect they command from their fellow players. Sobers had both. He was admired not only for his immense talent but also for his personality, elegance and sportsmanship. Tributes following his death came from cricketing legends across generations, including Brian Lara, Sunil Gavaskar, Sachin Tendulkar and Virat Kohli. That breadth of admiration is significant. Sobers belonged to one generation, but his influence crossed generations.

Sir Garry: In 1975, Sobers was knighted for his services to cricket. He was later inducted into the ICC Cricket Hall of Fame in 2009.

But perhaps the most fitting recognition came from the cricketing world itself. For decades, whenever the question was asked, **"Who is the greatest all-rounder cricket has ever produced?"**, the name Garry Sobers was almost certain to be part of the answer.

His Test batting average of 57.78 is extraordinary for an all-rounder. His 235 wickets demonstrate that his bowling was not incidental. And his fielding completed the package. He was, quite literally, a player who could do almost everything.

More than numbers: Yet perhaps the greatest tribute to Sobers is not found in a scorecard. It is found in the memories of those who watched him. Older generations of cricket lovers often speak of Sobers with a special affection. They remember the elegance of his cover drives, the power of his strokes, the unusual variety of his bowling and the sheer athleticism of his fielding. They remember that when Sobers walked onto the field, something could happen.

The end of a great innings : Sir Garfield Sobers passed away just eleven days before his 90th birthday. His death brought tributes from across the cricketing world. The ICC described him as one of the greatest cricketers ever to grace the game. His generation is slowly disappearing, and with it goes a particular kind of cricket — cricket in which a single extraordinary individual could occupy almost every role on the field.

Sobers belonged to that era. But his achievements belong to cricket itself. And yet numbers cannot capture everything. They cannot capture the elegance. They cannot capture the courage. They cannot capture the joy with which he played. They cannot capture what it felt like to watch Garry Sobers at his best.

A fitting farewell: Every generation of cricket has its heroes. Some are remembered for their batting. Some for their bowling. Some for their captaincy. Some for one unforgettable innings. Garry Sobers was remembered for all of them. Above all, he was a cricketer who made the game look beautiful.

Sir Garry Sobers has now played his final innings.

But like the great innings of 365 not out that remained on the record for 36 years, his legacy will remain for generations.

The scoreboard may record his runs and wickets. Cricket lovers will remember the magic.

Farewell, Sir Garry.

Thank you for making cricket a more beautiful game.
